- Opportunity for those who desire action

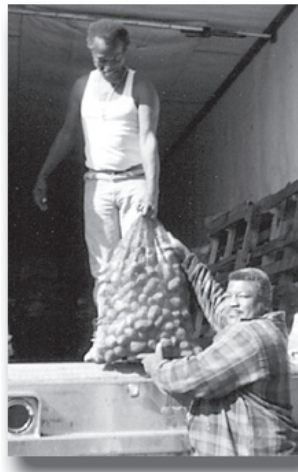
A Grass Roots Ministry

More food is wasted in this country every year than is needed to feed the more than 40 million Americans who don't get enough to eat – and to feed them every day! The Society of St. Andrew (SoSA) partners with farmers, volunteers, financial supporters and hunger relief agencies to bridge this hunger gap simply and effectively by salvaging fresh food that will go to waste and delivering it to those in need. More than 92¢ of every dollar donated to SoSA goes directly to providing food for the hungry at about 2¢ per serving. SoSA's partners prove that *Gleaning America's Fields ~ Feeding America's Hungry* makes a significant difference in the lives of the hungry.

POTATO & PRODUCE PROJECT

Growers and food providers donate tractor-trailer loads of commercially unmarketable yet perfectly good, fresh produce to SoSA. We pay to package and transport this nutritious produce to food banks, shelters, and distribution agencies across the country, which use the food to feed the hungry.

Started by SoSA in 1983, this nationwide produce salvage program provides direct relief to the hungry while addressing one of hunger's major causes: food waste. 15 to 20 million pounds of fresh food are saved annually at a cost of about 8¢ per pound. This good produce, which normally would be dumped to rot, feeds our nation's poor and hungry with 45 to 60 million servings a year!



SEED POTATO PROJECT

This self-help program provides seed potatoes purchased by SoSA to impoverished communities in rural areas where people have access to land for gardening. The seed is donated to needy families through local service agencies. The families plant, cultivate and harvest their own crops, realizing a yield of about 8 pounds of potatoes per pound of seed planted. The *Seed Potato Project* builds community, self-sufficiency, and self-esteem while teaching agricultural skills and providing needed food.

GLEANING NETWORK

Gleaning is the Biblical practice of hand-gathering crops left after harvest. SoSA volunteers glean fields and orchards donated by growers, and then the produce is given to local food banks, pantries, soup kitchens, shelters and distribution agencies to feed the hungry. Tens of thousands of volunteers each year hand pick 15-20 million pounds of food to help relieve hunger in their own communities.



HARVEST OF HOPE

Harvest of Hope (HOH) is a gleaning and study program that educates youth and adults about the realities of hunger, its causes and effects. It provides participants with a basis for an ongoing commitment to responsible living in a hungry world. Designed for youth, young adults and intergenerational groups, weekend and week-long mission retreats are conducted Spring, Summer and Fall in various states around the country. *HOH* emphasizes the combination of gleaning,



study, and non-denominational worship to build a Christian community of service to meet the needs of the poor, homeless and hungry.

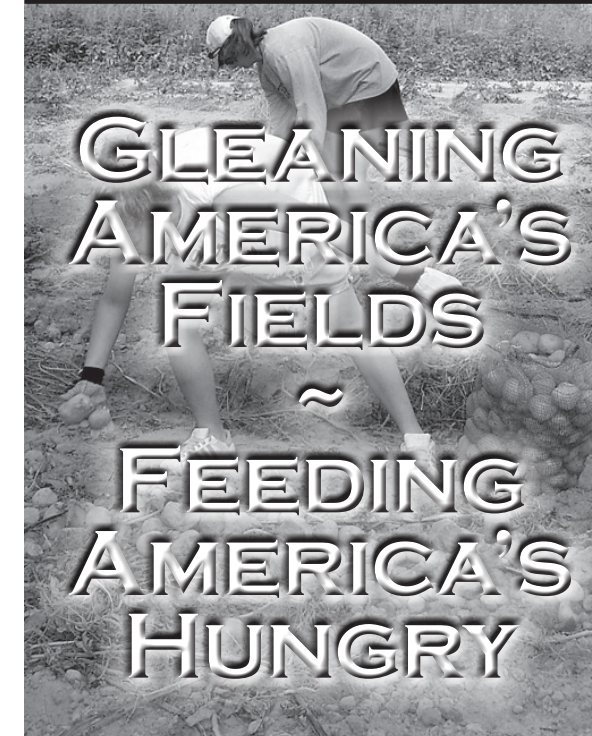
