

AT HARVEST OF HOPE, YOU'LL TACKLE HUNGER THROUGH...

GLEANING... Gleaning is the Biblical practice of gathering crops left in the fields after harvest. It is hard work, and depending on the weather, may be hot, cold, or wet work. The gleaned fruits and vegetables are distributed through food banks and agencies that serve the poor, homeless, and hungry. Gleaning is an opportunity for participants to use their hands to feed our hungry neighbors.



STUDY... Physical labor is matched with intensive study about hunger. Through Bible studies, simulations, movies, games, and discussions, participants become more aware of hunger and its causes.



LIFESTYLE AND NUTRITION... Participants will examine how their consumption of resources impacts others. Plenty of nutritious foods are served for meals and snacks. One evening, a hunger awareness meal is part of the learning experience. Harvesters also take time to celebrate blessings and have lots of fun!
